

#### **Affiliate recognition**

Congratulations to two of the Society's affiliate members who were recognized at the 2016 Governor's Awards Gala for outstanding contributions in their communities.

The **Town of Richmond Hill** earned the David Pretty Cup for the twelfth time in 2016. The Cup, instituted in 1981 and named in honour of a former Society governor, is awarded to the affiliate member with the largest lifesaving program in a community of 100,000 to 250,000 people. The key to Richmond Hill's success is its ability to coordinate the community's leadership needs, which it does by offering a wide range of programming from prep courses and re-exams to leadership programming and advanced courses for staff. The result sees individuals who are engaged, focused and continuing to grow as lifesavers in their communities.

The Darnell Cup is awarded to the affiliate that raises the most money for drowning prevention. In the overall category Pool People Limited (PPL) Aquatic, Fitness and Spa Group Inc. has won seven times since 2009. PPL consistently involves its staff in fundraising efforts including its annual swim-a-thon in which staff collect pledges that PPL matches. This is a great example of involving staff and community to raise drowning prevention awareness.

### Insurance for Canada's lifeguards

The Lifesaving Society Canada, in partnership with HUB International, introduces a comprehensive professional liability insurance program available only to Lifesaving Society members who hold National Lifeguard certification.

This insurance coverage provides professional liability and general liability insurance for instructors, trainers and lifeguards who are teaching any Lifesaving Society course or providing safety supervision in Canada.

This coverage will be of interest to those who need insurance to access rental agreements, to deliver Lifesaving Society programs independently from an employer (e.g., backyard pool lessons, canoe trip supervision), or to those who seek additional insurance protection to support their career.

HUB International brokers this program, underwritten by Encon Group Inc., for all certified National Lifeguards. To apply you must be a Canadian citizen, at least 18 years of age, and hold a current Lifesaving Society Canada National Lifeguard certification – current means within 24 months of the date of your last (re)-certification.

#### **Making the Swim to Survive School Grant program work**

Learning how to survive an unexpected fall into deep water is an important step in preventing drowning. That's why we created Swim to Survive. But every community in Ontario is unique, and to make the Swim to Survive School Grant program work, everyone approaches it a little differently and sometimes, gets creative.

- The Town of Hearst and Saugeen Shores both convinced their local power corporations to sponsor the program. Power corporations love to support safety-related causes like Swim to Survive.
- 12 affiliates have asked their local transportation companies for discounted Swim to Survive rates, or donations of one or more bus trips - all of their requests were granted.
- 22 Ontario school boards generously sponsored a portion of the costs; a majority of pools donate their pool permit fees and eight affiliates donate a portion of their instructor costs.
