WHAT'S NEW FOR EXAMINERS?

Part of the ongoing leadership revisions means some changes for Lifesaving Society Bronze, First Aid and National Lifeguard Examiners.

Examiner candidates must have taught or co-taught at least one course in the program stream(s) in which they seek examiner certification.

Steps to become an Examiner

- Successfully complete an Examiner course.
- Successfully apprentice with an experienced Lifesaving Society Examiner (Examiner Mentor as of January 1, 2019) on one exam in the stream(s) in which you seek examiner status.
- Certification submit completed Examiner Training Record documenting the teaching prerequisite, successful completion of Examiner course and apprenticeship directly to the Lifesaving Society Office.

What you are called?

- Bronze Cross Examiners will be known as Bronze Examiners.
- Standard First Aid Examiners will be known as First Aid Examiners.
- No changes for National Lifeguard Examiners.

What you can examine?

- Bronze Examiners who hold Distinction may examine Distinction.
- First Aid Examiners who hold CPR-HCP may examine CPR-HCP.
- First Aid Examiners who hold Airway Management may examine Airway Management.
- National Lifeguard Examiners may only examine the National Lifeguard certification option(s) they hold Pool, Waterfront, Waterpark, Surf.

What is an Examiner Mentor?

Examiner Mentors are senior Lifesaving Society Examiners appointed by the Society's Area Chairs to mentor examiner candidates through their apprenticeship phase and approve them for examiner certification. This is a new designation that will be implemented on January 1, 2019.

As of January 1, 2019 candidates who are looking to apprentice on an exam must ensure that the person they have made arrangements with has been designated as an Examiner Mentor.

Time is running out...



July 15-21, 2018 National Drowning Prevention Week

The Lifesaving Society designates the third full week in July as National Drowning Prevention Week (NDPW) to focus community and media attention on the drowning problem and drowning prevention.

The themes below are suggestions for how you can target your NDPW campaign and use specific messages to address drowning trends as reported by the Drowning Prevention Research Centre. Use the key messages on social media and be sure to include the **#NDPW2018** and **#SNPN2018** hashtags.

Key NDPW messages:

- 1. Approximately 500 Canadians die in preventable water-related incidents annually. Even one drowning is one too many.
- 2. Watch me, not your cell phone. Always directly supervise children around the water if you're not within arms' reach, you've gone too far.
- 3. Be Boat Smart and Boat Sober. Alcohol consumption is a factor in almost 40% of boating-related fatalities.
- 4. In most drownings, the victim never intended to go in the water and was often close to safety – could you survive a sudden and unexpected fall into the water? Learn to Swim to Survive[®].
- 5. Be Water Smart[®]. Make smart choices before going into or out on the water.
- Older but not always wiser Choose It. Use It. Always wear a Lifejacket or PFD when in a boat.
- 7. You can save a life, yours and someone else's. Take a learn-to-swim, lifesaving or first aid class today.
