National Lifeguard Instructors


If you plan on teaching National Lifeguard, you need to:

- 1. Find out when your employer plans to transition to the updated National Lifeguard program.
- Purchase and study the updated <u>National Lifeguard</u> <u>Award Guide</u>. Start with the "Note to National Lifeguard Instructors".
- 3. Update your teaching resources by purchasing the new *Teaching National Lifeguard USB*.
- Complete one of the three update options for Instructors. Details available in the <u>National</u> <u>Lifeguard Update</u> and on the <u>2023 Update Info</u> page of our website.

To teach or examine the updated National Lifeguard program, you need the updated <u>National Lifeguard Award</u> <u>Guide</u> with updated test requirements and evaluation standards for all National Lifeguard options.



Community spotlight – Orillia Lifesaving Team

Founded in the fall of 2022 with the support of a \$25,000 sponsorship from Hydro One, Orillia's Lifesaving Team is ready to make waves when lifesaving sport makes its Ontario return in 2023.

"The sponsorship from Hydro One was a huge benefit," recounts Christine Wareing, Orillia's Aquatic and Fitness Supervisor. "It helped pay for a lot of the start up costs and allowed us to market the program in the community."

"The City of Orillia worked hard to generate excitement and awareness of the team with videos, radio ads, social media campaigns and other marketing materials." Christine continued. "The most popular response that generated registrations was from the e-blasts through our online registration system."

All the marketing paid off – the Orillia Lifesaving Team currently has 50 members and counting. "We've had to adjust some of the schedules because of the demand – but that's a good problem to have!"

The team had their first practice October 12, and recently completed their first competition, participating in the fall session of the Society's <u>TeleGames</u>. Despite the club just getting started, the City of Orillia is already seeing the benefits of having lifesaving sport at their facility. "The coaches are enjoying it; the kids are having a blast, and the parents love the program. We even had one parent join the team and is looking into becoming a Lifeguard and Swim instructor".

What's next for the Orillia Lifesaving Team? Christine is already making plans. "The pool season runs October through June, so next is to continue participating in the TeleGames while we look into creating a waterfront version of the program to run during the summer." REQUIRED WATER SESSIONS IN BLENDED LEARNING

As of January 1, 2023, the Examiner course is no longer eligible for delivery via online learning. It remains eligible for delivery via blended learning.

The Society has updated its guide to the delivery of online and blended learning courses.

When Covid hit in 2020, the Society published the guide to provide affiliates with the flexibility to deliver leadership courses during a time when pools were accessible on a very limited basis, if at all. Now that the aquatic world has re-opened, we've updated the guide to reflect how we proceed going forward.

The <u>updated (December 2022) guide</u> identifies the blended learning courses that require in-water sessions. These include the Examiner and Trainer courses. The majority of candidates in these courses come from an aquatic background and typically start their Examiner and Trainer journey in aquatic programs. The in-water experiential component is important in the training of those in aquatic program streams.

The Society's *Program Guide* will be updated in the next edition.
